### ORDINARY BOARD MEETING - 17 MAY 2021

A meeting of the STCA Board took place on 17 May 2021, the following matters were discussed:

#### **Greater Hobart Vision**

Representatives from the Greater Hobart Strategic Partnership and State Growth provided a presentation on the *Greater Hobart Vision*. The Board was advised that community consultation on the Vision has closed, however, the purpose of the presentation was to seek feedback from the Board. The Vision is the first step toward a coordinated long term approach to planning and development in Greater Hobart. The second step will be the development of a *Metropolitan Plan* which will deliver the outcomes of the Vision.

### **Huon Valley Council Update**

Huon Valley Council provided a presentation on a range of priority projects for the municipality including the redevelopment of the Huon River Esplanade in Huonville and activation of a second commercial centre and relocation of the council depot to light industrial park. A range of other projects are also proposed for Dover, Port Esperance and Nicholls Rivulet. In addition to these projects, a range of tourism ventures have also been funded at Franklin, Ida Bay, Hastings and Cockle Creek.

### Southern Tasmanian Regional Land Use Strategy

The Board resolved to take a number of actions in relation to the review of the *Southern Tasmanian Regional Land Use Strategy* including seeking a meeting with the relevant Minister. The Board has recommended that the review of the STRLUS be undertaken concurrently with the development of the *Metropolitan Plan* and that a small working group be established.

#### **Regional Climate Change Initiative**

The Board approved the 2021/23 Regional Climate Change Action Plan. It has 17 actions across the key areas of council leadership; corporate (council) emissions and energy reduction; community (municipal / regional) emissions and energy reduction; corporate (council) adaptation and community (municipal / regional) adaptation. Workshops and municipal climate profile reports have been delivered to all STCA member councils as part of the Regional and Municipal Climate Profiles project.

#### 2021/22 Budget

The Board approved the 2021/22 budget.

#### **Other updates**

Updates were also provided on the activities of Destination Southern Tasmania; the Local Government Association of Tasmania and the South Eastern Regional Development Authority.

#### **Financial Report**

The Board noted the 31 March 2021 draft Financial Report. A copy is included with this Quarterly Report.

#### **Next Meeting**

The next Board meeting will be hosted by Hobart City Council and will be held on 16 August 2021.
